Holds Meetings

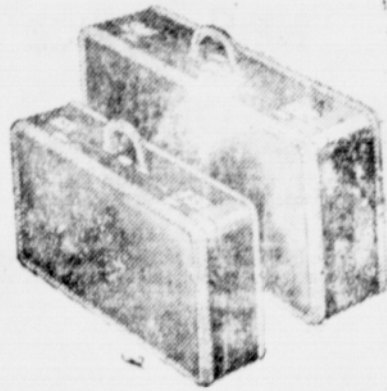
Winchuck 4-H Club
