School Census Has Changed

Adding machines would not have been of much use in handling the county's school money, back in 1882, when the school census for the entire area tallied a whopping 425, and schools ran for 3 months, the term, that year, beginning March 10.

The county received \$367.08 from the state that fiscal year. School District No. 1, (Port Orford) had a surplus of \$16.19, left over from the previous year, to which was added \$61.44 from the state and \$55.04 from county taxes, tallied \$132.67. Miscellaneous other revenues brought the treasury for that district up to \$183.87. The previous year they had spent \$152.38, so they had \$31.49 available for the three months school.

What with total county school incomes and the number of potential students between the ages of 4 and 20, education figured a cost of 36 and a fraction cents per student.

M. M. Bates was senior director of the Port Orford district and J. B. Tichenor (a former teacher) was elected district clerk.

At the teachers' institute, at Ellensburg, May 5th and 6th, 1881 were State Superintendent of Education L. J. Powell, County Supt. C. E. Philbrook, A. M. Gillespie, J. F. Maars, Mrs. E. H. Canfield, Mrs. Clara Merriman.

Every year the Forest Service fixes up the roads, when they figure they'll stay fixed, and travel must wait until word comes that the roads are in their usual good summer shape.

The best way to find out the condition of the road you plan to use is to call the local office of the Forest Service. They'll know, or can find out, conditions you can expect to encounter.

This year will probably be exceptional with the unusually late storms and cold. As soon as the hot sun hits the hills and gulches about everything in the way of plant life will be busting out, all at once, instead of the usual orderly parade Mother Nature marshals when the elements are less temperamental than they were this Spring. Prospects are very good that you'll find growing wild, many posies suspected of wandering away from your garden, penstemons, coropsis, lilies, saxifragas, bleeding hearts, mimulus, larkspur, and many, many others but they're prospering where the Creator put them and it's a pretty good idea to leave them there.
