## SAVINGS BOND SALES GO UP

April was a record Savings Bonds month in Curry County and Oregon.  
Total pre-sales of Series E and H Savings Bonds in the state for April amounted to \$4,123,936. This is 68% more than sales for the same month a year ago, according to Oregon Savings Bonds Committee Chairman, Ted Gamble.  
Curry had \$25,926 April sales compared to only \$5,871 last year. That this record is part of a healthy growth is shown by sales for January through April of this year. They amounted \$17,394,816. This is 39% more than were sold during the same four months last year.  
"Of particular interest are the H Bond sales" Mr. Gamble said. "For April investors purchased \$1,237,500 as compared with \$272,500 for the month last year. Obviously Oregonians are rapidly becoming familiar with this newest addition to the Savings Bonds family."

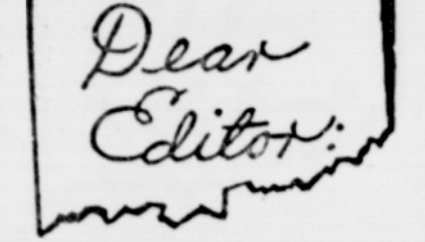

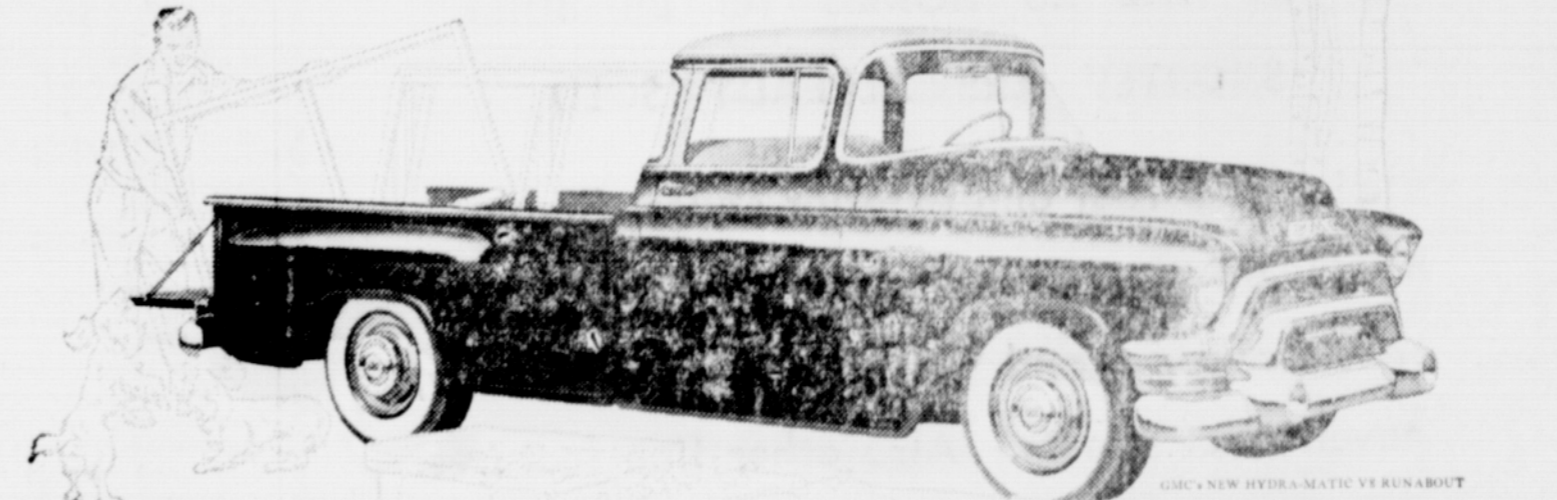
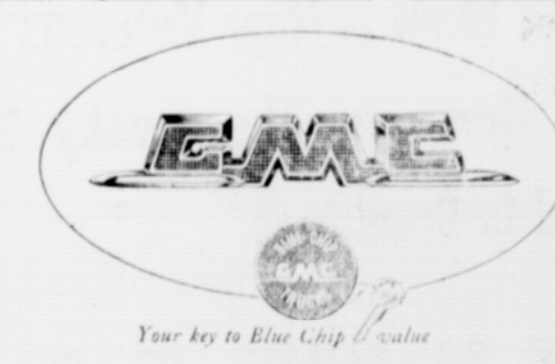
