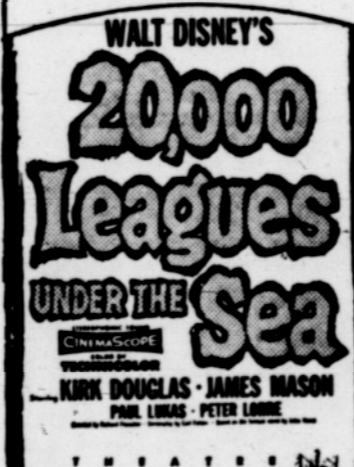

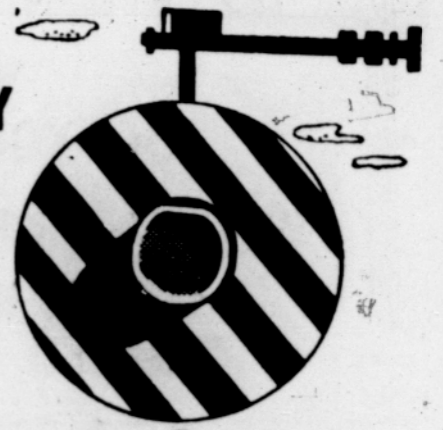
## HOLLIDAY PICNIC
