I must confess I am a bit confused after reading of each council meeting in the paper, of the different plans and schemes of buying, signing over free of charge recommendations of so-called "citizen committees" etc. etc. all dealing with the express purpose of acquiring the sewer system now in use.

The city council of Brookings hired for \$900 a competent firm of engineers from Corvallis, Ore. to make a survey of the sewer system and the job has been finished. On page 46 of their report are their recommendations, and recommendation No. 1 is "That the status of the existing sewer system be clarified."

The engineering firm in their report have appraised the entire present system less depreciation at approximately \$29,000. Where will the \$29,000 come from to pay the man who claims he owns the sewer system? Can this man give a title insured deed or is he merely selling his "right title and interest" the same as the citizen committee is asking the citizens of Brookings who are connected to this sewer to sign away all "rights title and interest" free of charge.

Then will this \$29,000 be assessed back again to the property of the people presently connected to the sewer? I caution the people connected to this sewer to be careful in signing away free of charge any of their rights title or interest, and you must have some, otherwise they would not ask you to sign them away.
