Curry Bond Sales Shoot Up

The average Oregonian likes U.S. Savings Bonds. During May he bought 3,281,427 dollars worth of Series E and H Bonds.

That the average Oregonian is interested in building up his holdings in Savings Bonds is shown by the fact that in May he put aside 41.6 percent more of his savings in Bonds than in the same month last year. And, for the first five months of this year he decided to buy \$20,676,243 worth of Savings Bonds, 39 percent more than he saved during the same period of 1954.

As a preferred investment, in Curry County alone, sales for May of this year totalled \$24,854, compared to only \$1,856 in May of 1954.
