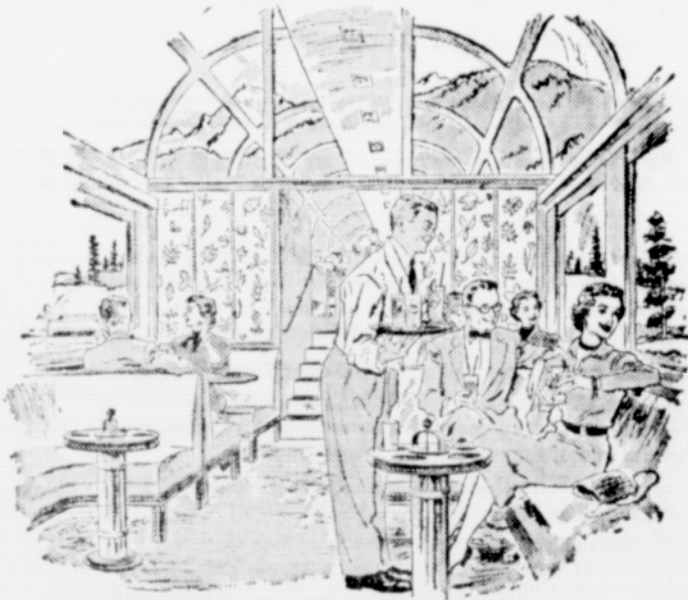

M. S. BRAINARD COMPLETES LIST

M. S. Brainard is compiling an alphabetical list of all the marriage returns of Curry County from the beginning. Several years ago Brainard took transcripts of many of the records in the court house, at Gold Beach, among them the weddings of Curry County residents up to 1920 and those of their lineal descendants. Brainard estimates there will be a total of some 2,500 entries sorted out from an estimated 35,000 names of people, who at one time or another, appeared in the county.
Brainard states Curry County was set up in 1854, and people started marrying, according to the records, very soon after.
His data is all willed to the Oregon Historical Society and is being kept up to date as additional data comes to hand.

BULB GROWERS HOLD MEETING HERE

There have been two important horticultural confabs in Brookings during the past week, with the daff growers, from the Umpqua to the Eel Rivers meeting in the VFW Hall, last Thursday afternoon and the lily people mulling over their problems the next day.
Lily growers are noting a considerable increase in botritis in their fields, undoubtedly due to the more than usually damp weather. They have been unable to get in to spray due to the moisture on the foliage making it impossible to get their sprays to stick.
