Glen Simpson is building additional shelves but the books cannot be arranged nor the drapes, contributed by Mrs. Jessie Judkins, hung until the painting is over with.

Ben Jones has the illumination and heating equipment installed and working although the library board lacked funds for all the fixtures so only half the main room is lighted. It will cost about \$350 to complete these units. Free help layed some 1400 square feet of floor tile.
 Value of the property, to date, is over \$15,000, of which the treasurer, Mrs. Lulu Goldizen, reports some \$8,000 has passed through her books the land is worth not less than \$4,500, and the difference is in donation, labor, materials, and some 3,000 volumes.

Whatever the value, with the exception of \$100 from Curry County, it has all come from the people of Brookings-Harbor area.

The City of Brookings is budgeting \$850 per year, none of which is paid as salary to anyone.
