Alton F. Baker of Eugene, Oregon, Governor of District 154 Rotary International, will visit the Brookings Rotary Club on Monday and Tuesday, July 18 and 19th.

Baker is publisher of the Eugene Register-Guard and he has been a member of the Rotary Club of his home city since 1927.

While in Brookings, he will conduct a Rotary Club Assembly composed of Directors and Chairmen of all Committees of the local Club. During the Assembly the entire work of the Rotary Club will be reviewed in all its avenues of service—Club, Vocational, Community and International service.

District 154 of Rotary International comprises the State of Oregon and several counties in southwest Washington.

Rotary International has just completed its Golden Anniversary year. The first club was formed in Chicago in the year 1905. A record convention was recently held in the city of Chicago, Illinois. Fifteen thousand delegates and their ladies attended from 65 of the 92 countries throughout the free world that have Rotary Clubs.

One of the great international features of Rotary International is the Rotary Foundation Fellowships for advanced study. Young men and women are afforded a year of study in a country other than their own. This year District 154 will select a Rotary Fellow for a year of study commencing in 1956. Applicants should apply to the Rotary Club.
