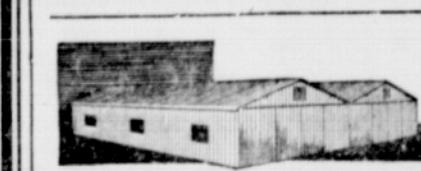

**BOND SALES**

**LEADS NATION**

Word has just been received by Ted Gamble, Chairman of the Oregon Savings Bond Committee, that this state led the nation in the percent of its increase of Savings Bond Sales for the first five months this year over the same period last year. The 42% sale-increase for the period in Oregon led the next highest state, Rhode Island, by more than three percentage points.  
"During World War II" Mr. Gamble said, "Oregonians became accustomed to leading the nation in War Bond sales, but it has now been several years since this state has set the pace in any phase of Savings Bonds activity. The spectacular increase in sales which 1955 has brought is a source of satisfaction, for a good many reasons."  
"The Federal Reserve Bank report for June sales has just been received, and indicates another spectacular gain. Oregonians last month bought a total of \$3,086,000
