The main exhibit is set up in a carnival square frame by the two highway semi-trailers. It tells the story of the birth, growth, size and importance of the West Coast fir plywood industry. This element of the show is built around the central theme, telling communities visited that fir plywood is 'Made Here—Sold Everywhere'. The story is told with accurate, detailed scale models, dioramas, photos and other graphic illustrations.

Among "Golden Ideas" displayed are these eye-catchers which gained top attention at the Portland exposition:

"Moke", a new design technique which takes advantage of the chief structural and appearance values in fir plywood; an indoor-outdoor kitchen which steps out ahead of the trend toward casual living; an indoor island-platform for living and sleeping that practically eliminates furniture and introduces a quiet Oriental flavor into American architecture; a way of utilizing the currently wasted between-wall space; new ideas in furniture, including a dramatic barbeque table built around a Japanese habachi cooker and many more ideas for garden and barbeque shelter.

The elements of the "Golden Ideas" are dramatized in a lighted full-color display.

The educational sound-color movies on plywood manufacture are to be shown in a "side-show" pavilion.

Following its stay here, the Jubilee show goes to Crescent City, continuing its tour of the West Coast regions where fir plywood is manufactured.

From . . .

Shorty Circuit

Many of you who have been troubled with a weak signal on your television sets during this dry weather have, no doubt heard how it helps to wash the antenna good with the hose. We have found this is often misunderstood, as it is not the antenna which should be washed, but the lead-in. During a dry spell, salt and dust accumulate on the lead-in (especially if it is of the ribbon type), then in the late afternoon and evening when the dew starts to form, it has a tendency to short out the lead-in, reducing the signal reaching the set but not the interference, thereby causing excessive snow and "picture jitters."

If, however, the above treatment doesn't seem to help much, there is the possibility of corroded terminals or broken lead-in. Just give us a call here at Evans Electric — Brookings 3444 — and Pat Holmes will be glad to go out and completely clean and check your antenna and if necessary, replace the lead-in.
