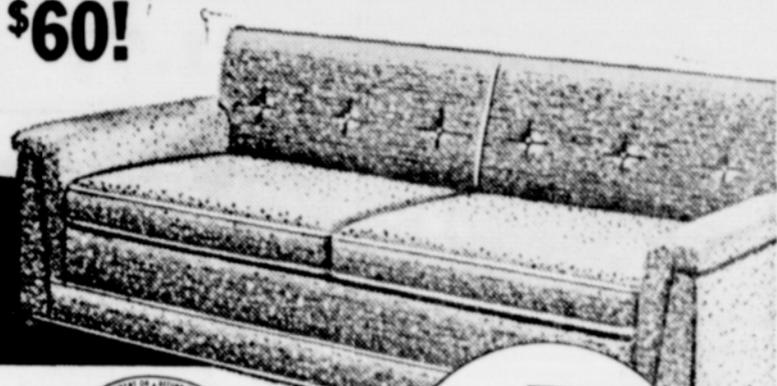

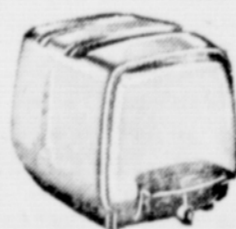

### FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH

On occasional jaunts around the state of Oregon, I am sometimes downright shocked by examples of shabby housekeeping. Some municipalities evidently have no regard for first impressions on visitors or prospective residents.

Any good housewife would be very much embarrassed if a stranger, or a friend, came to the house and found the front yard cluttered with junk and the interior of the home resembling a pig sty. Still many towns are in similar states of unattractiveness and, what is even worse, are seemingly indifferent to the degrading effect it has on a community.

Personally, I find myself judging a town by its appearance. If it is slovenly, if there seems to be no attempt at looking neat and ship-shape, I come to the obvious conclusion that the town lacks ambition, pride, and self-respect. I cannot help feeling that my judgment is similar to that of the average person visiting any community for the first time.

As a result of this reaction on my part, I quite naturally assume that the same sad state of affairs will be typical of the town. I would expect to find poor schools, few if any recreational activities for youth, inactive service organizations, and a dirty government which has long outlived its usefulness.

While much can be done by the conscientious citizen in keeping his own house and yard neat and pleasant, many of the eye-sores common to many communities today are out of the jurisdiction of the individual. Civic organizations, on the other hand, with the proper leadership combined with a sincere interest in the town's future, could find ample opportunity to utilize their efforts in behalf of city beautification.

City government, also, must assume its share of this responsibility even though it may call for expenditure with no actual cash return. Since towns exist as a result of pay-rolls, no progressive industry in its right mind is going to locate in a community where its employees cannot take pride in residing.

It therefore behooves any city desiring to participate in the expected growth of Oregon communities to inaugurate a house-cleaning immediately.

### PUBLIC LIBRARY HOURS ARE SET

The Chetco Community Public Library will be open for business on Tuesdays and Thursdays, from 2 to 5 p.m., and on Fridays, from 7 to 9 p.m. This schedule will prevail, at least, until school starts when it may be necessary to make a change to accommodate the young folks with whom these hours conflict with their classes.

With the putting into service of much expanded facilities and a greater public, all borrowers will be required to re-register and to have with them their borrowers' card before they can take books. All juveniles under the age of 16 must have their parents sign their card and all adults who are not actual property owners must provide local reference. This system is not only standard library practice but is essential to keep track of the volumes.

### Investigate Trip To Grants Pass

From Brookings, the O'Brien Post Office, near Selma, by the usually travelled route, is a little over 80 miles, and, cross country it is clocked at 58 miles, a saving of some 22 miles. The latter route however, is not for those who are fighting a clock although several new cars were seen along the way, peopled by those who were not in a hurry and who enjoy getting out in the fresh air.

Ben Jones and Mr. and Mrs. M. S. Brainard went on an investigating trip with an eye to reaching the Illinois from the east side, across from Fred Gardner's mine and became involved in an area known as 'Fiddlers Gulch' but plan a return trip now that the lay of the land is better in mind. The proposed route is westward from a point about a couple of miles north of Selma.

All the roads in the back country have been much improved though they are still, for the most part, designed for one way travel and to give access to the country. By the claim markers seen along the way, much of the country has been staked out for minerals and one must bear in mind the immediate meeting of another vehicle, any place. Passing can usually be negotiated, easily, but in places sometimes involves back-up to a turnout.
