TELL OF HUNTING SEASONS FOR CURRY COUNTY AREA

Dear hunting season in Curry County, this year will be during the first 21 days in October, only, and the bag limit is one deer having not less than a forked antler. This same season prevails in Coos, Josephine, Jackson, and west Klamath counties. The elk season for the coastal area will be between October 29 and November 13, 1 bull elk with 3 or more points being the legal limit. Tags are required for both animals. There are seasons with other limits and dates in scattered areas where permits are required. The state requires the return of all report cards attached to deer tags, whether used or not, to the Game Commission within 30 days after close of the season and if the owner does not comply he may lose out on a deer tag next year.

The pheasant season in all the counties is from October 22 to November 13, with a limit of four cocks in one day and not over 12 in possession. Valley and Bob White Quail, October 22 to November 13, west of the Cascades, excepting Clatsop and Marion counties, limit 5 a day or 10 in possession, aggregate, Mountain Quail, September 10 to 18th, 5 a day or 10 in possession Blue and Puffed grouse, west of Cascades, September 10 to 18, with a limit of 3 and 6. Band tailed pigeons, September 1 to 30, 6 a day or 24 in the entire season.

Report On Meters In County Area

There are 2649 electric meters on the REA circuits between Humbur State Park and the State Line, according to Harold Stokes, and he ought to know, as he is reading all of them once a month.

Stokes says his territory is divided into two districts from Pistol River north to the park, in which there were, at the moment 1085 meters and south, between Pistol River and the State Line, there were 1564.

The district to the north of Pistol River has experienced a 30 per cent increase in the past three years while the increase in the Brookings area for the same period is a bit less. This is due, Stokes says, to there having been a previous upsweep in the southern section which has, at the moment, levelled off, somewhat, and the additional activity in the Nesika Beach area.

There has been such increase in the demand in the northern section that a new substation is being installed on the Macleay Range, about four miles north of Cold Beach.

BUILDS HOUSE

Within one weeks time, Gunnar Hedbergs house on Harris Heights road looks like a house. Built by Ed Aldrich on a Lu-Re-Co plan, the building started Monday, and the tar paper will go on the roof Saturday. The foundation was poured previously, but all the walls, and trusses and the rest went up this week.

The house will be a three bedroom house with full basement.

1955 crop figures, just released by the U.S.D.A., would, under accepted business procedure, indicate a decline in consumer prices. The peanut crop is 50 percent greater this year than last but the retailers will probably be counting them into sacks instead of scooping. The cotton crop is 30 percent above the average yield, yet cotton holds the lead in our most expensive fabrics. Iowa farmers, alone, are holding some 50 million bushels of government purchased 1954 corn on their farms and this year's crop is the second largest ever known in the country and 17 percent over last year's. Oats, sorghum, grains, soy beans, etc., all exceed the 1954 yields.

After the department released its 1955 crop forecasts, some prices dropped: soybeans, 6 cents; corn, 3 cents; and cotton, 32 pts. Secretary Benson made no statements in the brief story here quoted on peanuts-count or scoop!
