FOREST RECEIPTS HITS RECORD

Net national forest receipts in the Pacific Northwest Region were at an all-time high during the fiscal year ended June 30. Receipts to the federal treasury of \$38,179,777.48 amounted to 49 per cent of the total receipts of the nation's national forests, including Alaska and the Tropical Region.

According to Regional Forester J. Herbert Stone, this year's net receipts climbed \$7 million over the previous year. Nationally an increase of \$11,571,192.90 has occurred.

About 99 per cent of the receipts came from sales of timber and forest products. Fees from grazing, power, and land uses made up the rest.

As provided by law governing national forest receipts, 25 per cent of the receipts of each forest is returned via the state to the counties in which the national forest is situated, in amounts proportional to the national forest acreage therein. The law provides that the money be spent for roads and schools. Counties having areas of more than one national forest share in the returns from each forest.

In addition to the receipts from national forest land, the Forest Service deposited in the federal treasury receipts from O & C lands placed under Forest Service administration by Public Law 426 passed by the 83rd Congress. These receipts amounted to \$1,271,250.63. As specified by this law, 75 per cent of this amount is returned to the counties in which those O&C lands are situated.

Disabled veteran applicants for reduced rate hunting and fishing licenses must annually submit proof of current disability rated at 25 percent or more. Previously, they only had to file evidence once. If qualified, fishing or hunting licenses cost them 50 cents each of \$1 for the two. Proof of disability will be sent to the veteran, upon application, including his "C-number," to the Veterans Administration, 208 SW 5th St., Portland, 4, Oregon. License application forms may be had from the State Game Commission, 1634 SW Alder, Portland, and the signatures upon them must be notated.

Veterans of the Spanish War, Philippine Insurrection, and the Texas Uprising need not supply disability certificates, according to the new law.

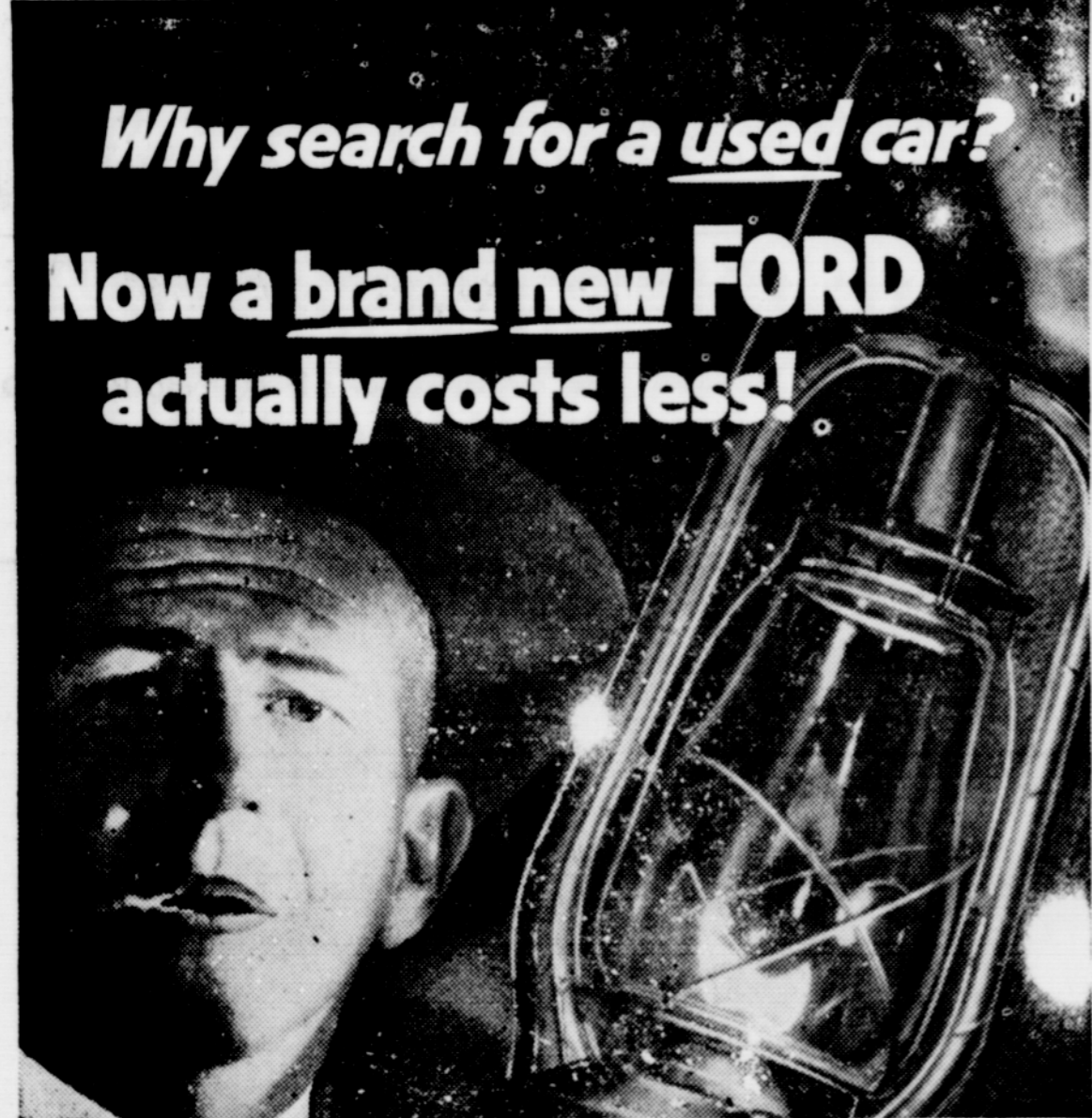
