Azalea Garden Club will present its 1955 Fall Flower Show, "Autumn Treasures", Friday, September 23rd in the Grange Hall in Harbor. Doors will open at 1:00 p.m. and the Show will continue on through the evening. The Tea Room, according to Mrs. Roy Weideman, Chairman, will be open to serve delicious home-made pies all during the exhibiting hours.

Many interesting and educational displays have been planned for the event. Judging the exhibits will be Mrs. Harry Smith of Cave Junction, Oregon. A Sweepstake prize of five dollars in cash will

be awarded the winner of the greatest number of Blue Ribbons in the Horticultural Classes. The Artistic Arrangement classes will not be awarded ribbons but will be scored according to points as follows:

- 25% Color Combination
- 10% Relation to Container
- 25% Proportion and Balance
- 20% Distinction and Originality
- 10% Suitability of Combination of Materials
- 10% Condition
- 100%

This system should give everyone an opportunity to understand and

learn how arrangements are judged without placing too much emphasis on competition.

In keeping with the theme of the show will be the "Treasure Chest" grab bag offering beautiful and out-of-the-ordinary gifts and handmade articles for sale, at a real bargain!!!

- SECTION II — FRUITS AND VEGETABLES**
- VEGETABLES—a tray, basket or platter of 6 kind grown by exhibitor.
- FRUITS—"Treasures from the Orchard", a selection of fruits or berries on a tray, grown by exhibitor.
- SECTION III — ARTISTIC ARRANGEMENTS**
- Class 1. "Vacation Memories"—an arrangement to suggest mountains, farm or seashore.
 - Class 2. "Autumn Tones"—a bountiful arrangement in fall colors featuring flowers and/or vegetables and fruits.
 - Class 3. "Holidays Ahead"—an arrangement for Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, or New Year.
 - Class 4. "A Pitcher of Posies"—a pouring container of any size, to be viewed from all sides.
 - Class 5. "Container Treasures"—an arrangement in your favorite container
 - Class 6. "Just for Fun"—driftwood, planter, dried arrangement, potted plant, pressed flowers, etc (Non-Competitive)

- SECTION IV — JUNIOR CLASSES**
- Class 1. Age 5 and 6. Combination of flowers with a toy.
 - Class 2. Age 7 and 8. Combination of something from the beach with something from the field or garden.
 - Class 4. Ages 11 and 12. Flowers pouring from a cream pitcher; bright colors in pottery and delicate colors in glass
 - Class 5. Special Section for all ages. (Advance entry)

SHOW RULES

1. Entries are open to all interested in growing flowers, shrubs, vegetables and fruits, and using them to the best advantage in the home.
2. All entries will be registered from 8:00 a.m. till 11:00 a.m. Friday, September 23.
3. Specimens exhibited in Section I and Section II, must be grown by exhibitor.
4. Flowers and foliage used in arrangement classes need not be grown by exhibitor.
5. Sweepstakes prizes will be awarded to the winner of the greatest number of Blue Ribbons in the Horticulture classes.
6. Exhibits may be removed after 10:00 p.m. Friday, or between 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Saturday, September 24.

SECTION I — HORTICULTURE CLASSES

- 1. Asters, 3 stems
- 2. Antirrhinum (snapdragons) 3 stems of one variety, 5 stems assorted
- 3. Begonia (tuberous) 3 blooms in a flat container
- 4. Calendula, 3 stems
- 5. Calla, 1 stem white, pink or yellow
- 6. Carnations, 3 stems one color or 5 stems mixed colors
- 7. Chrysanthemum, 3 sprays 1 variety or 1 spray of each, 6 varieties
- 8. Daisies, 3 stems English, African Transval (Gerbera) or Shasta
- 9. Dahlias, Ball, one color 3, mixed 5
- 10. Dahlias, Cactus, one color 3, mixed 5
- 11. Dahlias, Formal Decorative, one color 3" to 8" 3, mixed 5
- 12. Dahlias, Formal Decorative, one color 8" or over, 3, Mixed 5
- 13. Dahlias, Informal Decorative, 4" to 8" one color 3, mixed 5
- 14. Dahlias, Informal Decorative, 8" and over, one color 3, mixed 5
- 15. Dahlias, Miniature, one color 3, mixed 5
- 16. Dahlias, Pompom, one color 3 mixed 5
- 17. Dahlias, Semi-Cactus, one color 3, mixed 5
- 18. Dahlias, Single, one color 3, mixed 5
- 19. Fuchsia, single, one branch to 16" double one branch up to 16"
- 20. Fuchsia (trailing) single one branch up to 16", double one branch up to 16"
- 21. Fuchsia, Trailing or Bush, 3 up to 5 blooms in flat container
- 22. Gaillardia, 3 stems
- 23. Geranium, 3 stems single or double
- 24. Gladiolus, 1 spike yellow smoky, lavender, salmon, white or red
