Hayes and Merryfield, the engineering firm hired by the city to make a water survey, and previously a sewer survey was read. The letter suggested an outline of procedure to follow for the city in acquiring the present sewer system.

The letter suggested that the city as a whole would pay for part of the existing system, while the property owners affected would pay the majority of the cost. The break down suggested was \$2,318 to be paid by the city, and \$26,725 to be assessed to benefitted property owners.

The long letter pointed out that some of the owners have paid before, but there seems to be no alternative, and it would be the same with people having gone through the expense of installing septic tanks.

It was suggested that a \$50,000 bond issue be raised, and revenue from sewer service charge would be coming in. The remainder of the \$50,000 would start the establishment of a sewer district, which would be paying itself off, and then other districts set up.

Discussion of acquiring funds from the federal government was discussed, providing that bonds cannot be sold on the regular market.

The meeting ended, after which the council discussed department head difficulties, concerning mainly personal conflicts. The council, after hearing reports, gave an oral vote of confidence to the various city department heads.

**National Letter Writing Week Begins October 2**

"National Letter-Writing Week" was established to bring to people of this country a fuller realization of what letters really mean to the citizen and to renew the public's interest in the Postal Service and the important part it plays in the day-to-day life of Americans.

First celebrated in 1938, National Letter-Writing Week has grown to the point where it has become accepted as an annual event by many Americans. Governors of many states and Mayors of many communities now issue proclamations setting aside this week as a tribute to the Postal Service, to the Postal workers, and as a means of generating more interest in writing more letters.

This year, October 2 through October 8 has been designated by Postmaster General Summerfield as National Letter-Writing Week.
