The Rainbow mothers are asked to meet at Mrs. Roy Brimm's at 8 p.m. on the evening of Oct. 11th, Tuesday.

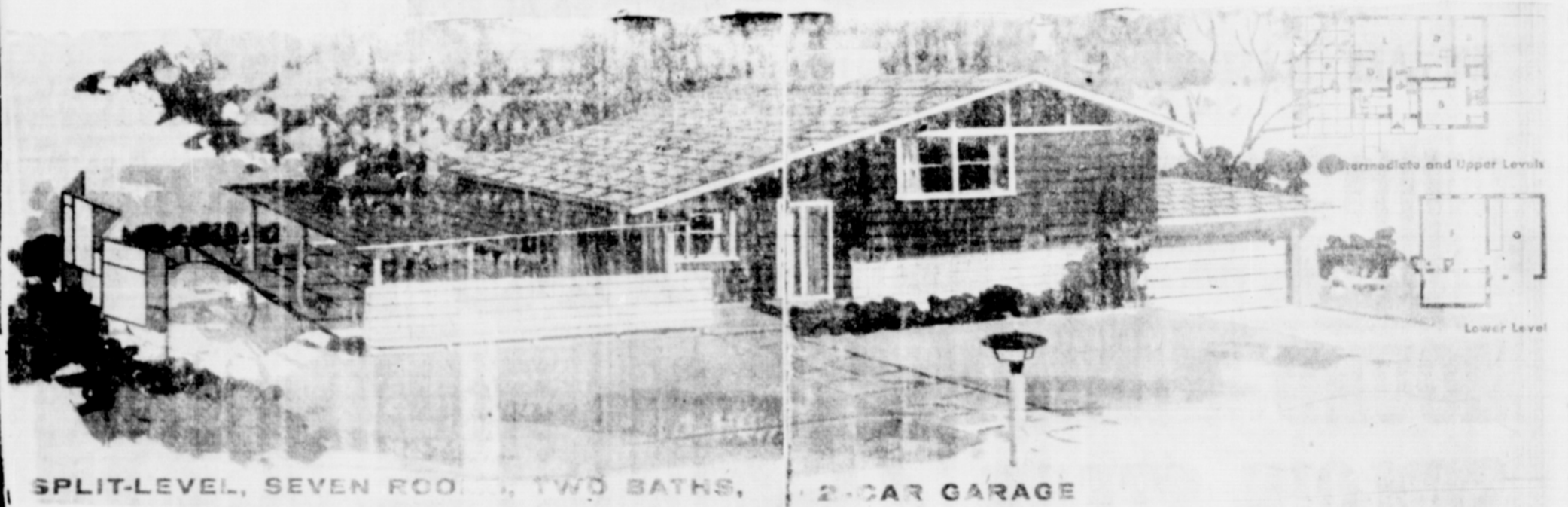
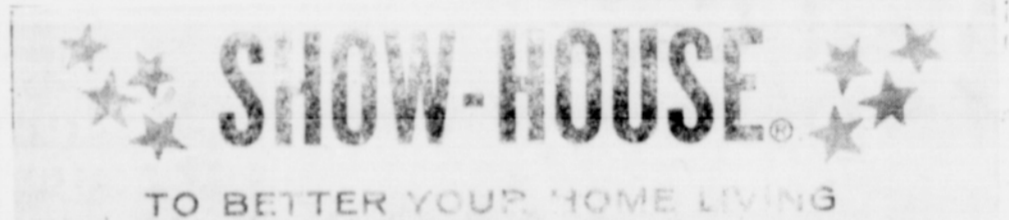
