Modern Packaging Method In Lumber Industry

Modern packaging methods are
being used in the log handling in-
dustry, according to a recent re-
lease.
At the loading site, flexible steel
ribbons are secured about the
entire load, binding the whole in-
to a non-shifting mass. The bun-
dle of logs are dumped in the con-
ventional way, still tightly bound,
greatly simplifying further hand-
ling, especially when made up
into rafts and economical of space
when assembled at the booms.

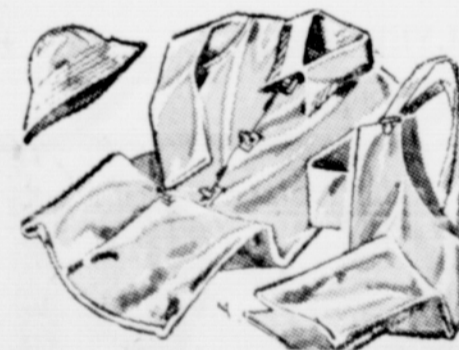
