One Of Largest Trailer Courts On Oregon Coast Being Developed Here

One of the largest trailer courts on the Pacific Coast, is well on the way toward accommodating 200 units, according to Lloyd MacAdams, who with Mrs. MacAdams bought the Sunset Court from Mrs. Gertrude Cole some years ago. The area being developed consists of six acres upon which the couple already have eleven units completed and occupied. The expansion idea was given impetus through a fantastic natural increase in available water. MacAdams says he is convinced his source is more than sufficient to take care of the proposed expansion, including the present cabins and those which he will now go ahead and build.

MacAdams had built a 900-gallon concrete tank, fed by three springs and from which a 2500-gallon per hour adequately sup-

plied his former layout. One afternoon, he heard water running down in the gulch where his tank is located, and upon investigation, found three more small and one huge hole burst through the six inch thick sides of the tank, the reservoir half full of mud and sand, and the water pouring in—and out. Securing additional pumps, he managed to bring the level down so as to clean out the sediment and is replacing the former pump with one pumping 5500 gallons per hour.

MacAdams is installing all cast iron sanitary system leading into four oversize septic tanks. The Co-op is connecting a complete sewer system to the site. The equipment with which the modern trailers are supplied. The first 40 by 60 foot laundry unit is being built and made ready for inside or

outside drying of clothes, and there will be available an abundance of hot water at all times.

Plans call for the whole area to be of concrete, drives and all, with the exception of proposed landscaping in the area.
