A thought came to me; had Mr. Webster lived in this town, his rhyme might well have gone thus:

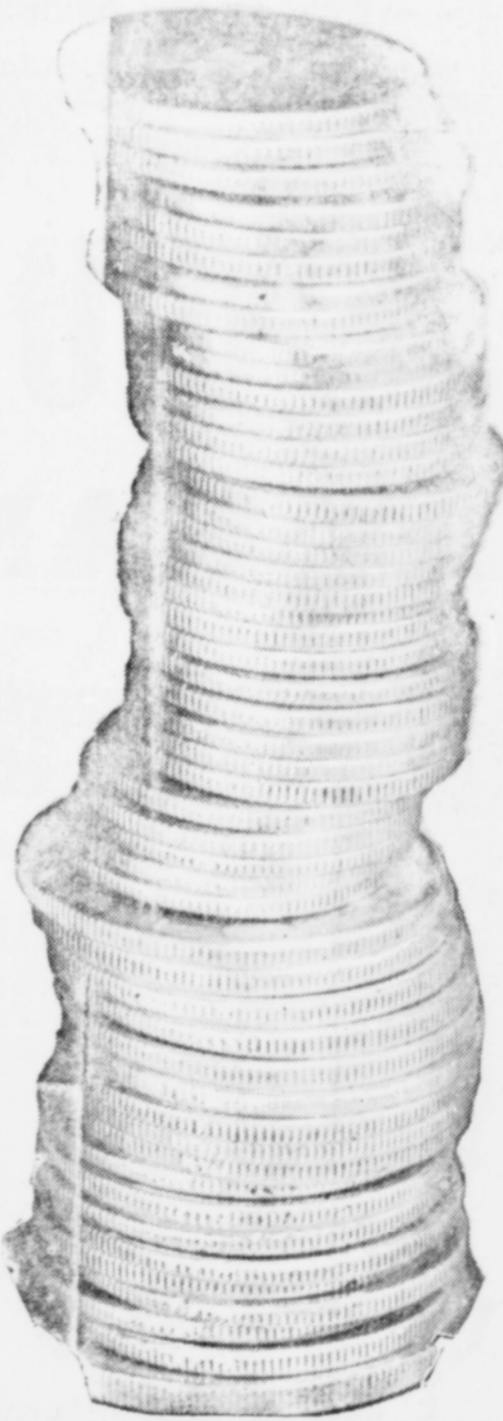
In Brookings where sluggards sleep.

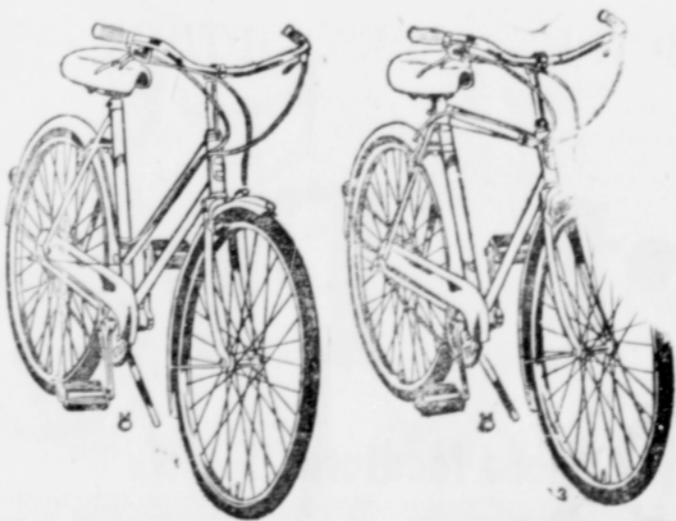
