National Forest Timber For Sale

Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Grants Pass, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 P.M., December 15, 1955 for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 46 acres within Sections 6 & 7, T. 40S., R. 12W., W.M., Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 2250 M bd. ft. more or less, of Douglas-fir, and other species of sawtimber. No bid of less than \$29.55 per M bd. ft. for Douglas-fir, and other species will be considered. In addition to the price bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.20 per M bd. ft., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.60 per M bd. ft. to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement will be required. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the forest supervisor prior to 2:00 P.M., December 15, 1955. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. A money order, bank draft or certified check for \$10,000 must accompany each bid to be applied to the purchase price, refunded or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Forest Service bid forms for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale, and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Brookings, Oregon before bids are submitted. On November 28, 1955, at 8:00 A.M. a forest officer will be available at Brookings Ranger Station, Brookings, Oregon to explain the conditions of the sale and to conduct a tour to show the timber offered for sale.

Coyotes Fall To Hunters Gun

Predatory animals killed 52 known farm animals in Curry County in the third quarter of this year. Thirty-seven were sheep and 15 were goats. Bears destroyed 28 of the sheep and 14 of the goats; coyotes got three sheep.

This information comes from the state department of agriculture at Salem and is based on the quarterly report of the Fish and Wildlife Service which this year has recorded livestock losses which hunters come across as well as predatory animals taken under joint federal-state predator eradication program.

Two hunters, Wilbur Browning of Sixes, and Alvin B. Richey of Brookings, work in this area. During September, these hunters took 21 predators—7 coyotes and 6 bobcats, 4 bear and 4 raccoons.

The September predatory animal catch throughout the state totalled 1,023, about three-fourths of which were coyotes.
