MORE FUNDS REQUESTED

A meeting was held in the Curry County Court House offices of H. D. Olney, county welfare agent. Additional funds amounting to \$10,486 will be asked of the State Department of Public Welfare, according to Olney, the increases being as follows. Old-Age Assistance payments from \$35,931 to \$43,092, an increase of \$7,161; General Assistance, from \$6,240 to \$9,000, an increase of \$2,760 and various medical funds to \$2,500.
