TRAFFIC AT STATE LINE —
The seasonal traffic slowdown is indicated by releases of cars from the Smith River Station. In October there was a tally of 1,000 passenger cars passed in as against 5,805 in November. Complete tallies of all vehicles at all entry stations into California shows. The figures show there was a slight increase in volume during 1955 compared with those of '54 although in '55 some 3,500 fewer passengers were checked in California than crossed in 1954.

HUNTERS ARE ASKED TO RETURN REPORT CARDS

Now that the big game hunting seasons are over for the year hunters are urged by the game commission to fill out and return the stamped, addressed report cards that were issued with the deer and elk tags.

All hunters are required by law to return the report within 30 days after the close of the hunting seasons. Failure to return the cards can result in the hunter being refused a hunting license next year.

The game commission points out that these cards are essential in determining the number of animals by sex taken by hunters and the total state-wide harvest of big game animals. Such information is needed when considering future regulations and management of Oregon's game herds. Accurate figures can be obtained only if all hunters cooperate in supplying the information needed.

If the report card has been lost or misplaced, a regular 2-cent postcard will do containing the following information: the number of days hunted, the animal's sex, number of points on

each side of the animal's head, buck deer or bull elk, the county in which the animal was killed, and the nearest town or landmark.

The card should be mailed to the Oregon State Game Commission, 1834 S.W. Alder, Portland, Oregon.
