BIG GAME, POND DUCK LEAFLETS ARE AVAILABLE

Two new informational leaflets have been added to the series of publications on Oregon's fish and wildlife, the Oregon Game Commission announced today. The leaflets titled "Oregon's Big Game" and "Pond Ducks of Oregon" are available to the public free of charge.

The 4-page leaflets give brief facts and identifying features of each of the "dabber" or pond ducks that are found in Oregon and one each of the big game animals of the state.

Informational leaflets on Oregon's fish and wildlife now number six in series. The other four include leaflets on Oregon's Upland Game Birds, Salmon of Oregon, Oregon's Fur-bearers, and Trout of Oregon.
