Neuberger To Support Insurance

A telegram from Sen. Richard L. Neuberger to the Pilot this week reported that he has joined with Senator John F. Kennedy as co-sponsor of a bill for federal flood insurance.

The telegram as follows: Editor the Pilot: For your information have informed John F. Kennedy of Massachusetts that I will join with him to co-sponsor bill for federal flood insurance in session of congress starting in January. Because private insurance so rarely provides for victims of flood disasters, federal government must take steps to see to it that such tragic losses are born financially by the entire nation rather than by isolated communities which may be set back decades if forced to carry the whole burden.

Rebuilding and rehabilitation should be a national responsibility, with the risk not bearing down on one or two affected areas. It is my hope and purpose that legislation of this kind will be passed and will assist flood victims, in New England, the Pacific North West and all the other regions of our country in the future.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that a special election shall be held within the corporate limits of the City of Brookings, Oregon, on January 20th, 1956, at which time and at said election the qualified voters of the City of Brookings, aforesaid, shall vote (1) upon and approve or reject the construction of a sanitary sewer system within said city and (2) the issuance of a general bond issue in the sum of \$50,000 to be applied upon the costs of the construction of said sanitary sewer system.

For the purposes of conducting said special election all qualified electors residing in Precinct Number 1 of Brookings, Oregon, which said precinct shall comprise all of that territory within the limits of said City bounded on the North by Chetco Avenue (U.S. Highway No. 101); at the polling place which has been established in the Odd Fellows Hall, located at 547 Hemlock Street; and all qualified electors residing in Precinct Number 2 of Brookings, Oregon; which said precinct shall comprise all of that territory within the limits of said City bounded on the South by Chetco Avenue (U.S. Highway No. 101); at the polling place which has been established in the City Hall, located at 702 Chetco Avenue.

The dividing line between said precincts shall be the line of the middle of Chetco Avenue, (U.S. Highway 101.) Byron L. Brimm, Mayor of the City of Brookings, Oregon.
