

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

Notice of Special Election to acquire and construct a sanitary sewer system and facilities and to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds by the City of Brookings in the sum of \$50,000.00 to apply thereon.

On January 20th, 1956 in the City of Brookings, Curry County Oregon, from 8:00 o'clock A.M. until 8:00 o'clock P.M. the following propositions will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Brookings, for their approval or rejection:

AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF A SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM AND FACILITIES.

Shall the City of Brookings, Oregon acquire and construct a sanitary sewer system and facilities within the corporate limits according to the plans, specifications and estimates of costs therefor as the same are on file in the City Hall of Brookings.

Shall the City of Brookings, Oregon authorize and issue general obligation bonds in the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars to apply on the acquisition and costs of construction of the sanitary sewer system and facilities authorized and approved by its electors.

The above propositions, if adopted, will authorize the City of Brookings, Oregon, to acquire and construct a sanitary sewer system within the corporate limits of the City and permit the City of Brookings to authorize and issue general obligation bonds in the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars to apply on the costs and expenses of such acquisitions and construction thereof.

The total sum of general obligation bonds which are now, or have been authorized and issued by the City of Brookings, Oregon, is "None."

The City precincts and County precincts within the City of Brookings will have uniform boundaries. The polling places in the City for this special election will be at the same places provided by Curry County for state-wide elections, and to such places as the election boards may legally adjourn.

The City Council has named and appointed the necessary judges and clerks of election to serve in such offices at the said polling places, as said election boards.
