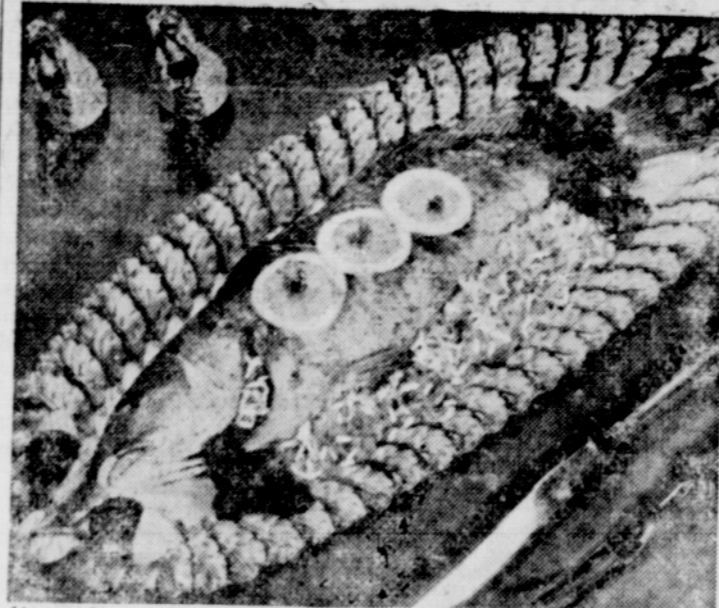


A son was born to Mr. and Mrs. Richard Seeley this morning, Thursday, January 19th, according to a report from Dr. Ronniger's office.

**RICE - STUFFED BAKED FISH**



1/2 cup butter or margarine  
2 tablespoons minced onions  
1/2 cup dry bread crumbs  
1/2 cup cooked rice  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
1/2 teaspoon paprika  
1/2 teaspoon basil  
1/2 teaspoon dill weed or seed  
1/2 teaspoon minced parsley  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
Cook onions in butter until soft. Remove from heat. Add crumbs, rice, salt, pepper, paprika, basil, dill weed, parsley, and lemon juice. Mix lightly until blended.  
1 1/2 to 4-pound whole fish  
2 tablespoons butter or margarine  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
2 slices lemon  
1/2 teaspoon paprika

Have fish cleaned and scales removed. The head and tail may be removed if desired. Wash thoroughly.  
Fill cleaned fish lightly with the stuffing. Fasten opening with skewers or toothpicks and thread. Spread butter over entire fish. Sprinkle with salt and pepper.  
Cut lemon slices in half and place in center of large baking pan. Set fish on lemon slices. Sprinkle with paprika.  
Bake in moderately slow oven (350° F.) about 45 minutes, or until fish flakes easily. Baste frequently with additional butter or salad oil. Serve on heated platter, garnished with additional lemon slices and parsley. Yields six servings.
