**1950 HUNTING ACCIDENTS**

The State Game Commission reports a slight decrease in fatal hunting accidents in 1956 as against the year before while they recorded an increase in the non-fatal accidents. The day after New Years Day, a 19-year old lad started this year's list by shooting himself in the spine with a 25-30 rifle, attributed to the accidental discharge of a loaded rifle being carried in his car while bobcat hunting.

According to the Commission's report, there were 10 hunting fatalities and 56 non-fatal accidents in 1955.

Causes given for all accidents were the same old bugaboos that

have plagued hunters in the past—accidental discharge, line of fire, loaded gun in car, and loading or unloading a weapon—all of which were in direct violation of some rule of gun safety. Only three casualties occurred where the hunter mistook the victim for game. Nine accidents occurred when loaded guns were being carried in the car and twenty-one accidents were self-inflicted. Deer hunting claimed the most of the victims with 27 casualties from rifle fire, followed by shotgun blasts during the pheasant season, with 15.

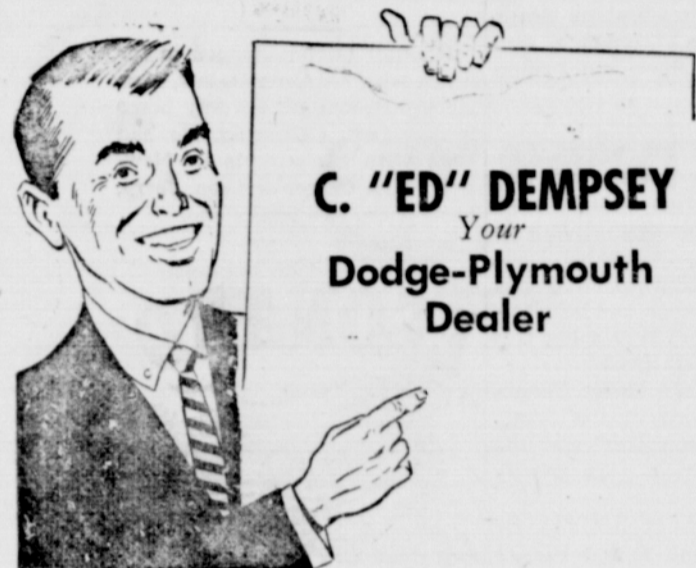
