

HATFIELD FILES FOR STATE POST

The filings for various Oregon State offices to be voted upon at the coming primary election are being made in the office of the Secretary of State.

Mark Hatfield has filed for Republican nomination for Secretary of State. Earl T. Newberry, the present holder of this office, has held the office for the period allotted under state law and can not further succeed himself in this office.

Hatfield is a member of the present State Senate from Marion County. He was born in Oregon in 1922 and resides in Salem. He is Dean of Students and a professor of political science at Willamette University. He was a commissioned officer in the Navy during World War II and participated in the Iwo Jima and Okinawa invasions.

He has received a great amount of support, following his announcement of candidacy, among the Oregon Press. He will probably be chosen by the Republicans to be their candidate for Secretary of State at the coming November general election.

Hatfield's education and political experience in the Oregon Legislature indicate that he will give good service to Oregon as its Secretary of State.

BUG STATION FIGURES TOLD

11,143,399 people were checked into the State of California in 1955, according to the summary issued by the Quarantine stations at the 17 points of entry. About half of these were in California-licensed cars, nearly half in out-of-state cars, and a little over a million came in by stage. These figures show but a small increase over the entries in the year previous. Peak passenger entry was reached in July when over a million and a half passengers were checked in. In August, about 150,000 less, and June and September running close. February was the lowest with 556,827.

During the year, Smith River turned in 376,670 passenger entries, and the station on Highway 199 reported 430,584. Over at Hornbrook, on 99, some 797,081 passengers were entered and at Doris on Highway 97, 587,223 passengers entered. A remarkable factor in this annual report is the number of commercial vehicles entering California. At the Doris station, 54,637 rigs entered, of which three-fifths were of the out-of-state registry. This total was only exceeded at Yuma and Blythe ports. The Alturas station had the lightest traffic, in all categories, of any station reporting.

Ragland will bring up to date matters on conservation and his talk should be of wide interest, especially because of the huge conservation now being practiced in the National Forests. 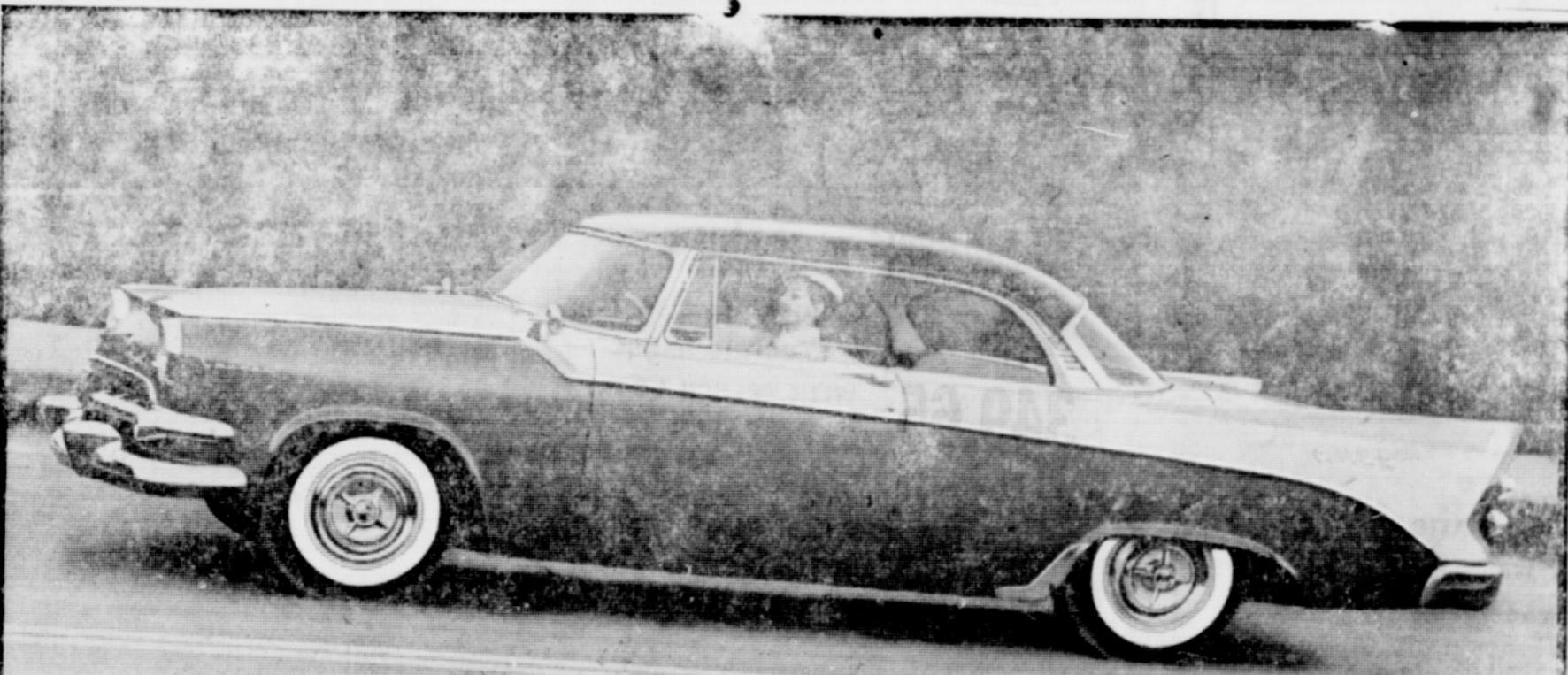
