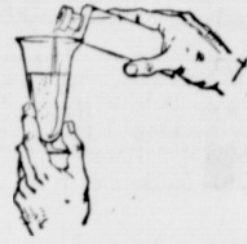
## ANDREA NAMED AS HEAD OF HEART FUND

The campaign is held in February. Andrea has been active in many civic enterprises during the past few years, taking part in the March of Dimes and the United Fund campaigns as well as the Heart Fund. He explained that Heart Fund campaigns are staged only in those areas where the Heart Association does not participate in either the Community Chest, United Fund or other joint efforts.
