THESE PEOPLE LIVE HERE . . .

This is the third of a 26-weekly series giving a short biography of the people who conduct the businesses of the area. Their names appear in the Ad-Rime Directory in this issue.

KERR HARDWARE—The Kerr Hardware was founded in April of 1951. Henry Kerr had purchased the building and property from Mrs. John Gardner.

Subsequently the new Post Office building was constructed and was ready for occupancy in January '55. Besides the Kerr Hardware and the Post Office, the House of Shoes, Southern Curry Realty, Tots to Teens, The Crabb Accounting Service, the Mode O' Day and Ed Ackley's Offices are now located in the Kerr Building. Henry Kerr and his wife moved to Brookings from Packwood, Washington, in 1946.

The hardware store was opened as a partnership between Robert Kerr and Robert Rettke. Rettke opened the store alone because Kerr and not yet returned from the service. He was discharged in June of 1952 after 4 years with the 7th Infantry. Tike Rettke, brother of Bob, came down for a 2-weeks vacation after being discharged from the service in January of 1953 and never returned to his home in Tacoma. He has worked for the firm since that time.

Bob Rettke is married to Henry Kerr's daughter, Mariam. The couple have three children, Ronald in the first grade; Danny, 4 years old; and Gerald, 2. Bob served 3 years in the Army being discharged in 1953.

Bob Kerr and his wife, Phyllis also have three children. They are Tommy, 3 years; Linda, 2; and Gerry, 1.

The partnership features a full line of building materials, including finished lumber and plywood. They also carry a full line of hardware and electrical equipment.

MOORE'S VARIETY, AND APPAREL SHOP is owned and operated by Fred and Madge Moore. They came to Brookings in July of 1944. At that time they started out like so many of the early comers as lily growers. They purchased an 8-acre tract of land and were in the lily business.

One year later they opened

building from which place they moved to the present location in the Graysel Building on Chetco Avenue in 1947. In making the move they added to their lines of merchandise and expanded their space.

The couple states that they have enjoyed a prosperous business here and have great hopes for the future of the area. They have been active in the civic affairs of the community.

NEWS AND SWEETS is one of the newer businesses of the area. It was opened by Gary and Leta Morris in October, 1955. The Morris's purchased Young's Motel in April of last year, moving here from Lakeview, Oregon. There they had operated a skating rink and snack bar for 4 years. They purchased the Vincent Building in September prior to opening the new business.

They have a son, Gary Jr., working for South Coast Lumber Company. He has a wife and 3 children. Their daughter, Janet, is married to Jim Parke who works for Dunning Motors. The youngest son, Donald, is a freshman in the local high school.
