BROOKINGS PRECINCT NO. 1 —

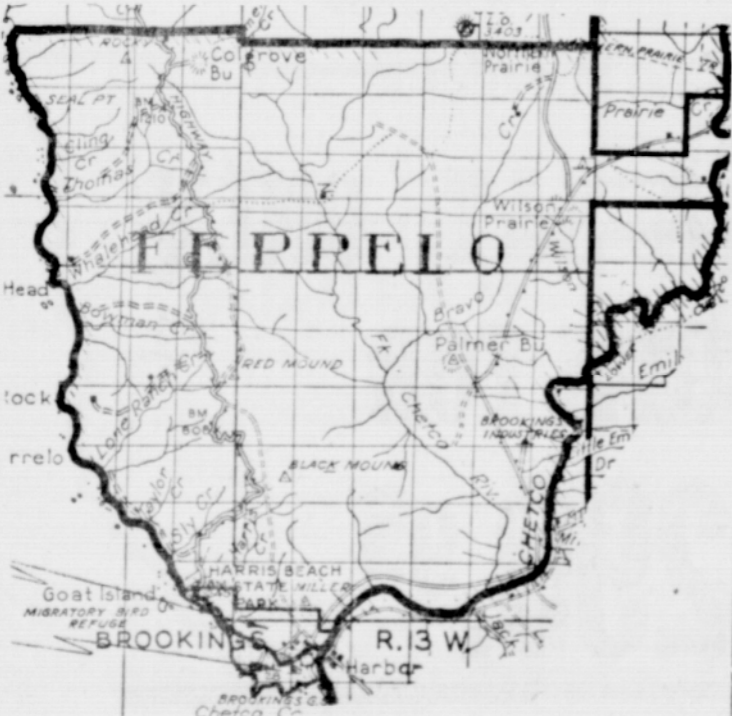
All residents on the oceanside of Highway 101 and between the Chetco River and the city limit boundary on the North of Brookings.
