Merchants who do not advertise are invited to read the following from the American Bankers magazine, as it might give them a new slant on business. YOUR business, as well as the matter of building up YOUR town.

"No businessman in any town should allow a newspaper published in his town to go without his name and business mentioned somewhere in its columns. This does not mean that you should have a half page or whole or a quarter page ad in each issue of the paper, but your name and business should be mentioned if you don't use more than a 2-line space. A stranger picking up a newspaper should be able to tell what business is represented in a town by looking at the paper. This is the best town advertiser. A man who does not advertise his business does an injustice to himself and his town.

The man who insists on sharing the business that comes to town, but refuses to advertise his own is not a valuable addition to any town. The life of a town depends on the live, wide-awake liberal advertising of the business men."

**PLAN ANNUAL  
 C.S.C. MEETING  
 FOR MARCH 1**

Cecil Watt, Chairman of Curry County Soil Conservation District announced today that final plans have been completed for the third annual meeting to be held at Sixes Grange, Sixes, Oregon on Wednesday, March 14th.

Principal speaker at the meeting will be William Sauerwein, SCS Farm Forester, from Albany, Oregon. With emphasis on farm lot forest conservation, the other speakers include Hardy Glasscock, State Industrial Forest Association; Harold Sesser, State Board of Forestry; and Harold Tower, State Conservationist for Soil Conservation Service from Portland, Oregon.

The meeting, which starts at 10:00 a.m. will include the noon meal served by the ladies of the Sixes Grange, and is open to all interested in conservation program.

Of particular interest to the farmers of Curry County, will be an explanation of Emergency Feed and Seed program available to flood disaster counties by George Jenkins, Coos County Agricultural Agent. Mr. Jenkins has indicated that he might be able to have a representative from the Farm Home Administration to explain the loan provisions of the emergency aid program.

Watt also stated that there will be entertainment provided during the program by local high school groups.

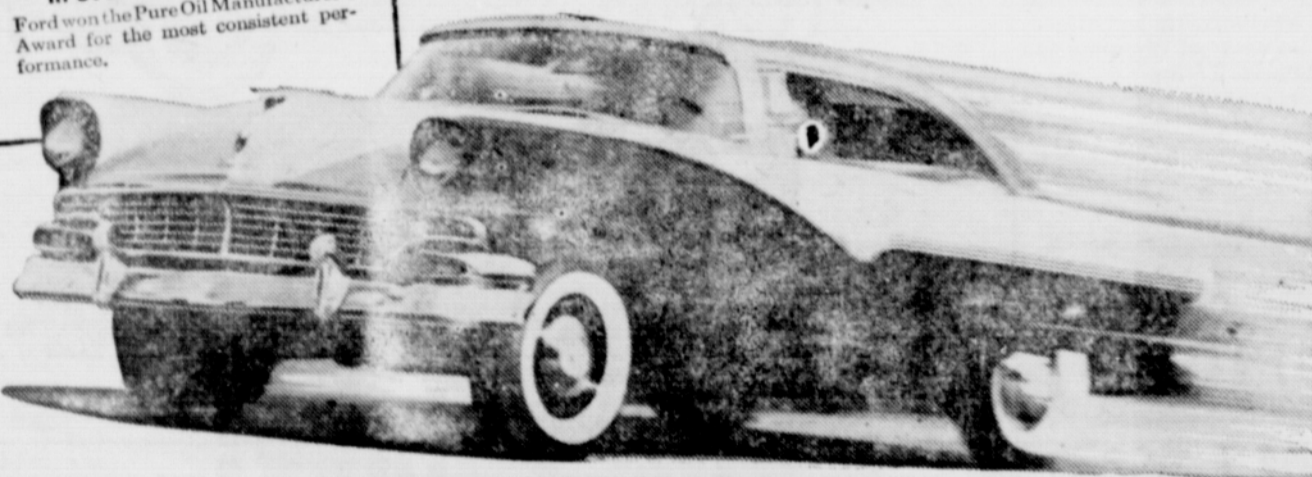
