SALMON SEASON —

Waters of Angling Zone One, which will close February 29 will remain closed to angling until April 28th, according to a statement by the Game Commissioner. This is to afford protection to spawning and spent steelhead and permits escapement of the young salmon to the ocean, prior to the opening of the trout season.

On the Rogue, below Mule Creek, and on other streams in the zone the season for Spring Run Chinook will open on Mar. 25th, and on the several up-Oregon coastal streams, the season will not open until the 31st of March, with bag limits remaining the same as last year.

AUTO COSTS —

The more you drive your car the less it costs. As every owner knows, his car costs him a certain sum and he continues to pay fixed charges, licensing, insurance, depreciation, regardless of whether it is driven one mile or ten thousand miles. The AAA has figured the cost per mile to each person in a family of three is 5.2 cents if the car is driven 5,000 miles per year, but if the vehicle makes 15,000 per year, the cost per mile for each member of the family is cut to 2.5 cents per mile. It follows that in order to get your money's worth out of the car, take long trips with it and to keep costs down for both you and the other traveler—DRIVE SAFELY.

BROOKINGS PRECINCT NO. 1 —

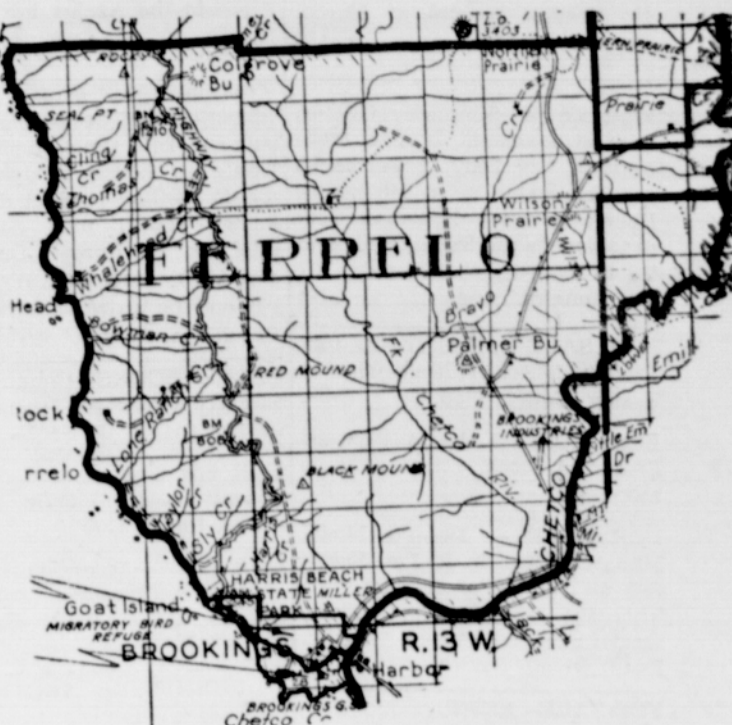
All residents on the oceanside of Highway 101 and between the Chetco River and the city limit boundary on the North of Brookings.

All residents not residing within the city limits of Brookings and North of the Chetco River. (See Map)

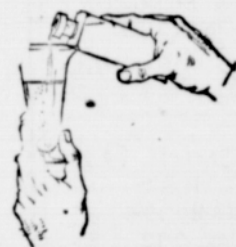

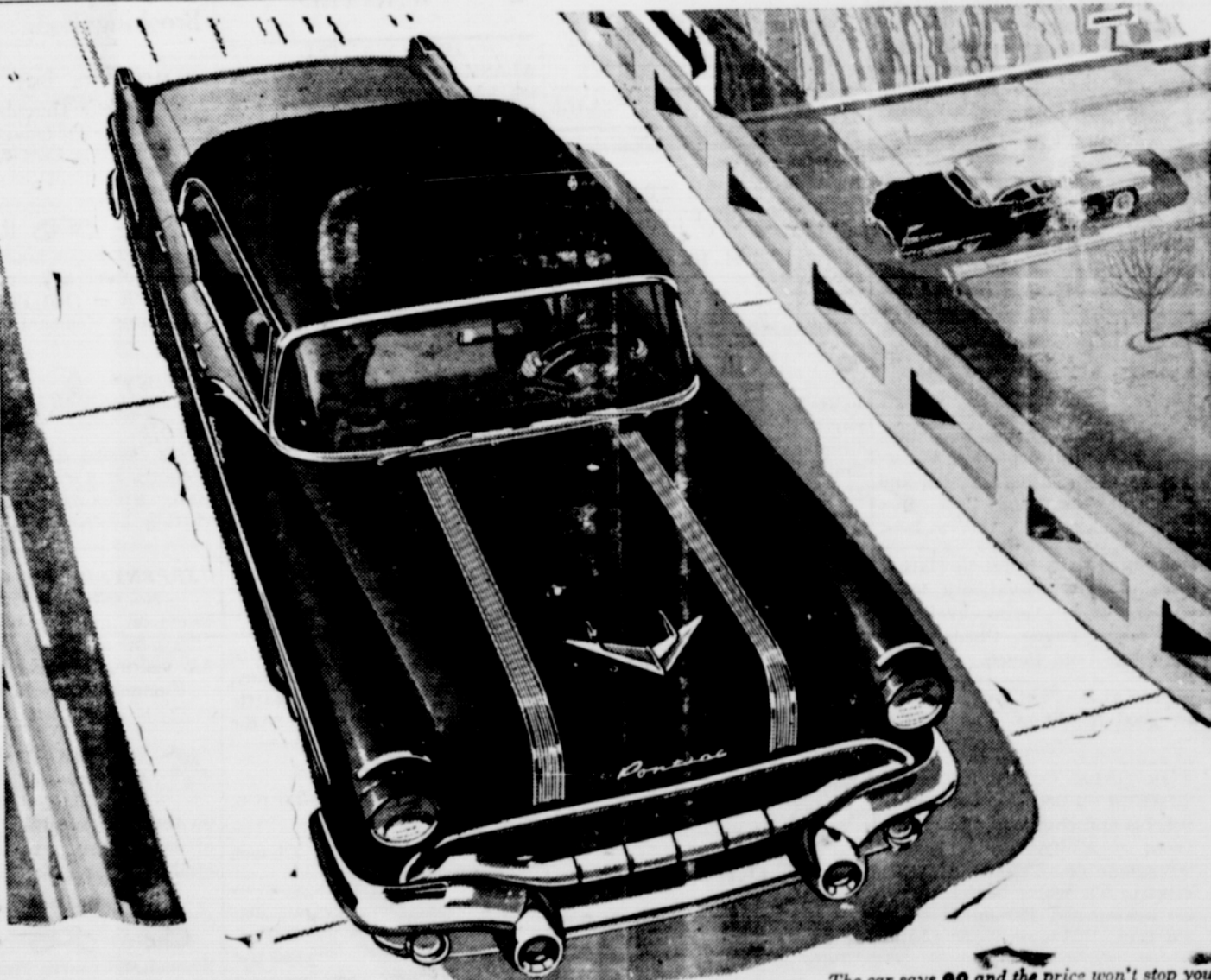
