EASTER SEAL DRIVE SOON

The most intensive Easter Seal sale in the history of Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults will get under way in each of the state's 36 counties Saturday (March 10) according to Mrs. Earl Snell of Salem, State Chairman.

The sale, which provides the society with nearly all of its operating funds, will continue on through April 10, augmented by a variety of special events in many communities.

Mrs. Snell, widow of Governor Earl Snell, expressed hope that "the excellent work among Oregon's physically handicapped children will prompt the people to respond generously."

She estimated that approximately 500,000 people in the state will receive Easter Seals in the mail, making the 1956 sale the biggest to date. In addition, she said, practically every community will stage a sale of paper label lilies on the 20th of March.

School, fraternal, social and other departments will provide volunteers to conduct the lily sales on busy corners.

Principle projects of the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults, all of them financed principally through the sale of Easter Seals are: Easter Seal Hospital, Eugene, where special education, training and therapy are provided for youngsters from all over the state;

Camp Easter Seal, located on North Lake of Ten-Mile Lake in Coos county, the state's only summer camp for the exclusive use of Oregon's crippled children, and Craft Shop of the Handicapped, a retail outlet in the heart of Downtown Portland, where articles made by the physically handicapped persons are sold.

Obituary Is Said For Will McVay

Life's curtains were slowly and peacefully drawn, this last weekend, on another scion of earliest Curry County. Will, the son of William, who was a son of Hutson McVay, had been since early manhood one of the builders of his native county, into which his grandfather came from Kentucky in the very early 60's. The original family home was at Pistol River although Will, and his brother Benjamin, acquired land between the Chetco and the Winchuck where their acres yielded in a craft the brothers knew best—the raising of cattle.

Besides the operation of their large holding, the brothers, each of them, took an active interest in all matters pertaining to the county and helped guide and sustain it through many a difficult year. Despite all that went with that pioneering, both on the ranch and in matters political, they were rewarded in material things besides the satisfaction of accomplishment and it is upon the structure Will and "Bud" laid the ground work that their

successors are so firmly building. Will has gone from among us, but the spirit his people brought to Oregon and Curry County has not. It has been strengthened, down the years, because of the intelligent industry and prudence and neighborliness those people of Kentucky transplanted to the hills and benches of Curry County.

ALDRICH HEADS OPERATION 'H-I'
