Why take Millions of dollars to build a new road from near Coos Bay to Bandon when the southern section of 101 is falling apart?

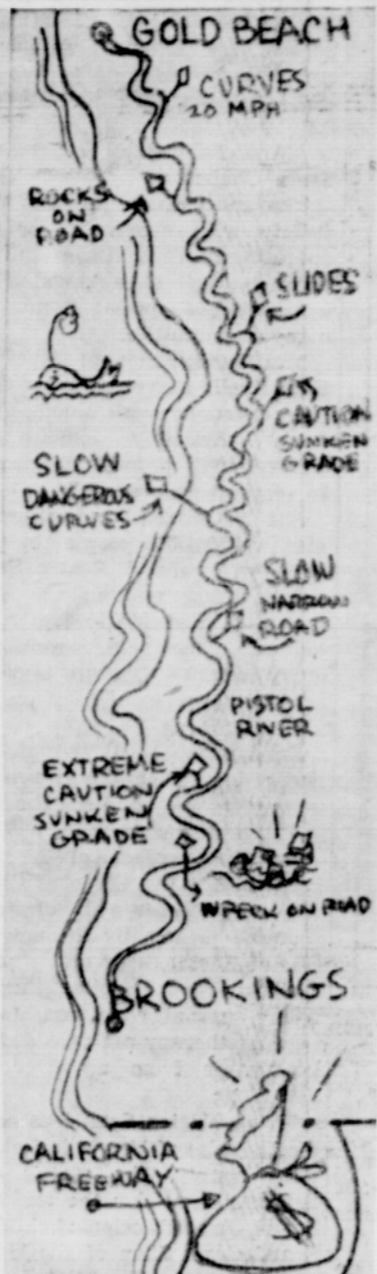
A new road from Brookings to Gold Beach is not an expense. It is a self-liquidating investment. One trip over this road is enough. Our tourist never return.
