

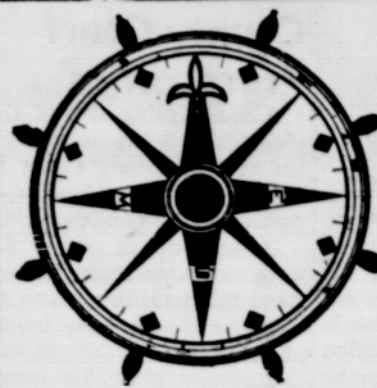
"HELLO" GIRLS GO —

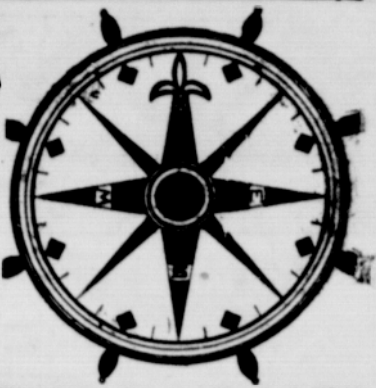

A capacity congregation greeted the Lewis and Clark College Choir at the Presbyterian church in the V.F.W. Hall last Sunday morning at the 11 a.m. service. The response of all who attended is that of sincere appreciation.

The choir presented the following compositions: "If By His Spirit" by Bach; "Come Blessed Repose" by Bach; "Jesu Dulcis Memoria" by Vittoria; "Saviour Throw The Heavens Wide" by Brahms; "O Gladsome Light" by Gretchaninoff; "Yea Through I Wander" by Schumann; "The Creation" by Scott; "Love in Grief," by Christiansen; and "O World Thou Choosest Not" by the Director, L.
