IT PAYS TO BE KIND TO ANIMALS. In all of Nature, the only known law of increase is that you must give to get. In other words, if you want to reap a harvest you must first plant your seed and give the planting the proper care. Or if you raise cattle or sheep or other livestock, to get good results, proper shelter and feed are necessary, otherwise the increase will be small and many of the stock dying because of lack of shelter and proper care. Everything has its price.

It is more profitable and much more sensible and humane to raise only the number of sheep or cattle or other livestock you can properly care for as to feed and shelter, rather than to try to raise an unlimited number of them only to find that many become sick or die for want of the proper care, and in many of such instances the predatory animals and dogs are unjustly blamed for such losses. Land that is run down from too much grazing, or is too rocky, or that washed badly during the winter rains is a pasture too meager to furnish enough food for a large number of head of stock and besides, such land is dangerous to the safety of the stock. There are sins of omission as well as sins of commission, and failing to properly care for one's stock is a sin.

Some years ago, I had a nice little home built south of Harbor and I thought that my happiness would then be complete, but the thing that marred that happiness is seeing so many of the lambs dying for want of a shelter and a little care, and also seeing other livestock being neglected.

Being unkind to animals or to your pets or to our feathered friends is cruel and in this day and age one would think that such barbaric traits no longer existed. In hunting season, sometimes a hunter shoots a deer without even following up the hurt/deer, leaving it to suffer a long time before it dies; and shooting at ducks and other birds for live target practice, and wounding them is certainly uncivilized and cruel. I know of a hunter whose gun accidentally discharged, hitting him in the stomach, that he made the remark that he now could understand how a deer must feel when shot and wounded.

Being kind to animals pays big dividends. As one would reap in life that one must sow, and as expressed by Ella Wheeler Wilcox: "Life is the mirror of king and slave, 'Tis just what you are and do, Then give to the world the best you have And the best will come back to you."
