Soil Conservation District Meeting Held At Sixes

Some forty people attended the March 14th Curry County Soil Conservation District Meeting at Sixes. The morning session was addressed by Wm. Sauerwein, SCS Farm Forester, of Albany,

who stated that the future forest system of the U.S. lies with farmers and other small holders and asked that farmers grow more trees. Andrew Schmidt, SCS engineer conducted a discussion of stream bank erosion and the various methods of preventing it, and Cecil Watt, of Brookings, gave an interesting talk on what he learned at the National Association in Boston, which he attended. Other speakers were Harold Tower, Portland, State conservationist for SCS; and David C. Shaw.

During the lunch hour, the group was entertained by Mary Lou Vincent, of Port Orford, with a saxophone solo, accompanied by Judy Marsh, and also dancing by Karen Howard and her mother, Mrs. May Howard, both of Gold Beach.

At the afternoon session, Clifford Smith, of the State Extension Service, discussed the emergency feeding program, followed by a panel discussion conducted by Harold Sasser, Andrew Schmidt, Hardy Glasscock, Tom Hurt, Dan Abraham and Sauerwein, the topic being Forest Farm Lot Practices.

Adjournment was followed by a pruning demonstration on the Ray Zumwalt farm, Sixes.
