MORE VET'S HOMESTEADS

War veterans are offered prior-
ity in acquiring 194 homestead
farms in the Mindoka
Irrigation project in Southern
Idaho, it is announced by Vere
A. McCarthy, service officer for
the Oregon Department of Veter-
ans Affairs. Applications must
be filed by May 7 with the Bu-
reau of Reclamation, Rupert,
Idaho. Forms are available in
Oregon from county veterans
service officers.

To qualify, applicants must
have two years full time farm
experience, must intend to en-
gage in farming, and must pos-
sess assets worth at least \$4,500
in excess of liabilities.

The farm units are in Mini-
doka and Jerome counties, Idaho.
The land is undeveloped, covered
with native grass and sagebrush,
and may be developed to grow,
under irrigation, potatoes, sugar
beets, beans, peas, alfalfa, clover,
beans, clover and alfalfa seed,
wheat, oats or barley.

THESE PEOPLE LIVE HERE . . .

(This is the 8th of a weekly
series of brief biographies of the
people who conduct business of
this area. Their names appear in
the Ad-Rime Directory on this
issue of the Pilot.)

DUNNING MOTORS is your
Curry County authorized Ford-
Mercury Dealer. The owner is
George D. Dunning, a man of
considerable background in the
automobile industry. Only this
last October he attended a deal-
ership conference held at Fair-
lane in Detroit. This is the old
home of Henry Ford. At the
conclusion of the conference, he
made a tour of the East Coast
and into Canada for the purpose
of observing the operation of
other dealers. It is his opinion
that the services and facilities
offered by West Coast dealers
far exceed those available in the
rest of the United States.

He also offered another inter-
esting observation that the labor
rate charged by the garages in
Brookings is the lowest on the
West Coast. At the same time,
he said the hourly scale paid the
mechanics is the highest he has
found in the nation. Generally
there are about 18 people em-
ployed at the Dunning Motors.
Prior to coming to Brookings
in 1954, Dunning operated a used
car lot for Pacific Motors, a
Ford-Mercury dealer in Port-
land. He also owned the Moun-
tain Shop, specializing in ski
and mountaineering equipment.
He sold this shop in 1954.
Mrs. Dunning is known as
Sally. They have one son, John,
who is 11 years old.

THE PETE J. LESMEISTER
AGENCY is named after the
founder and the present owner.
Insurance and real estate is his
business. Lesmeister, with his
wife, Ella, came to Brookings in
1945. For 17 years he had been
with the Great Northern Rail-
road, holding the position of
travelling freight agent.

Before leaving Klamath Falls
he made a survey of the state
and it was his opinion that the
then sleepy town of Brookings
had a future. He opened his real
estate and insurance in January
of 1946 in the Kruger Building.
Then he moved to the Central
Building, then the old Bank
Building, when the Oregon
State Bank forced him out of
there he moved to the Coos Cur-
ry location. In April of last year
he moved to what he expects
to be his permanent location, the
new building next to Palmer
Department Store.

Lesmeister is now serving as
secretary of the BPOE No. 1934,
having taken an active part in
obtaining the charter here. He is
interested in the development of
the community and has partici-
pated in many activities for its
betterment.

tained.

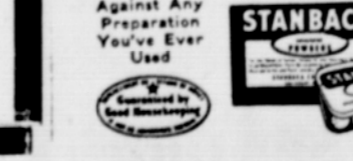
Mrs. Echols came to the area
