The automobile business is not new to Menning. He operated the Studebaker agency in Coquille for 14 years and later switched to Oldsmobile and also GMC. That agency is still operated with Menning as a partner. It is managed by his son, Bud, and his brother Gene Menning. In February of last year, Fred Bradshaw (Mrs. Menning's brother) bought into the local Buick firm and took over the parts department. He and his wife, Leora, also came from Coquille where he had been connected with the Western Auto Store and Leora taught school. They quickly purchased a home in Harbor and say they are here to stay. They have two small daughters in grade school.

C. "ED" DEMPSEY is your local Dodge-Plymouth dealer and can almost be considered one of the old timers here. When he came here from Crescent City six years ago to open up a used car lot in his present location, he recalls there wasn't a thing from the Kruger Building north. One of his customers was in a short time ago to buy a Dodge and he told Dempsey that when he first came to Brookings he felt sorry for him because he was so far out in the sticks. But now the same man, Almo Newton, observed that he is right in the heart of the city. Starting with a used car lot, Dempsey built the present building the latter part of 1952 and formed a partnership with E. K. Meadows of Crescent City to take on the new car lines. Dempsey has been in the automobile business since leaving the service in 1948. He served 4 years in the U.S. Navy of which he spent 3 1/2 years on board ship. He calls himself a "sea-going bellhop". Before he entered the service he had been with the Zellerbach Paper Co. for 25 years.

Dempsey is proud of the line he is handling and stated that he constantly checks the Portland papers to compare prices. Outside of "gimmick advertising" he said that prices here, not only in his agency but the others too, are in line. He also pointed out with pride that the firm is now supporting 7 families, 5 of which own their own homes.

Mrs. Dempsey is known as Helen. They have a son, Charles Edward, Jr., who is a pharmacist in Glendale, California.

VERN'S BAKERY is owned and operated by Vern and Helen Kreiger. They came here from Clatskanie in January of 1955

and opened the bakery a month and 3 days later. They had been in the baking business there for 8 years.

They moved their equipment from there and as soon as the building was completed they moved it in. It was the same time the Brookings Feed and Seed opened in North Brookings. They are now baking a full line of pastries which they carry in the shop. In addition they bake bread for the local grocery stores. Carolyn, who is a junior in high school, is their only daughter. She helps out in both the Bakery Shop and the Snack Bar after school and on Saturdays.

LOW WAYS AGAIN —

There is an apparently well sustained report that route truckers, including tank-truck drivers who have to make the trip between Gold Beach and Brookings are finding it very costly in unreasonable wear in their rigs as well as being almost impossible to drive due to the necessity of so many gear shifts. It is also taking inordinate amount of time compared to the distance travelled. Current reports are that the roadway is decaying rapidly in many places and one has to be very watchful for holes in the pavement.

BACKYARD CROPS —

If you have a backyard, and almost everyone has, why not figure on putting in a crop. Suggestions are fruit-cane berries, shrub fruits, and dwarf fruit trees.

Cane berries are familiar to most of us but the "shrub fruits" are rare—currants and goose berries, for instance. Why not put in a couple or two or three plum trees and a prune tree and there are hundreds and hundreds of places doing their best to sell us on the idea of dwarf fruit trees—apples, pears, and such all of which will do just as advertised if one treats them respectfully—not just set 'em out and forget 'em.

And, now is the time to feed your trees—all of them. Here is a way it can be done. Take an old broom handle or something on that order and shove it about six inches deep into the ground on a circumference under the extreme reach of the limbs. Put in about a tablespoonful of any common garden fertilizer, and kick some dirt in on top of it. Move around a foot or so, depending upon the size of the plant, and repeat. This gets the fertilizer out to where the thread feeder roots are and will really put the grub where it will do the most good. We'll probably have some more dampness to wash the fertilizer in good, thereby distributing it.

One can raise, in an area now perhaps an eyesore, a very respectable batch of quite acceptable grub.

To assure a still better crop, year after year, the plants must be taken care of, dormant spray-

ed in season, pruned, fed, and a patch of loose soil mulch under them.

And then too, a few producing shrubs, vines or trees in one's back yard may tease a potential buyer into unlimbering his pen a little more free supposing the owner wants to make a deal.
