### BUGS EATING?

Inspect your plants, and especially strawberry plants. If you find half-moon shaped pieces chewed out of their edges, strawberry weevil larva are working on them and steps should be taken, immediately, and kept up, to destroy them. Not only do they ruin strawberries, lily bulbs, but even girdle, just beneath the surface, several ornamentals including azaleas. When the larva hatch they appear on the surface as dark gray fellaers, about the size of a grain of wheat and with a shark beak. They're looking for a place to lay their eggs so's to hatch more grubs to eat when their parents leave. They can be eradicated if firmly pressed between two solid surfaces.
