Are you SURE you are reg-  
istered to vote in the precinct in  
which you live?

The county clerk tried to send  
a registration card to every reg-  
istered voter. If you received  
yours and your name, precinct  
and party are correct, you are  
O.K.

If you have not, it might save  
you much time and trouble to  
check with the official local poll  
books of your precinct at the  
City Hall. If you have recently  
registered, your name may not  
be in those poll books and the  
probability is you will have a  
card from the county clerk, any-  
how. The poll books to be used  
at the forthcoming primaries  
will include the names from the  
old poll books AND the more re-  
cently registered.

SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI,  
STATE CONSTITUTION**  
Notice is hereby given that an  
election will be held Monday,  
May 21, 1956 by the Rural School  
District of Curry County, State  
of Oregon, in all component  
school districts of said Rural  
School District.  
The election will begin at 2:00  
p.m. until 8:00 p.m. and will be  
held in the schoolhouse in each  
said component districts. The  
purpose of the election is to sur-  
mit to the legal voters of the  
rural school district the ques-  
tion of increasing the tax levy for the  
fiscal year beginning July 1, 1956  
over the amount limited by Sec-  
tion 11, Article XI of the Con-  
stitution.  
The reason for increasing such  
levy are: The necessary expense  
of operating the schools exceeds  
the tax base of the Rural School  
District, which is the sum of  
the tax bases of all school dis-  
tricts in the County except  
school districts No. 2CJ and 17C.  
The amount of tax in excess  
of the six per cent limitation pro-  
posed to be levied by the rural  
school districts of Curry County,  
Oregon, for the fiscal year be-  
ginning July 1, 1956 is \$136,895.45
