Looks like there'll be some sunburned youngsters pretty quick, shirtless ones being in evidence after the winter's bleaching, indoors.



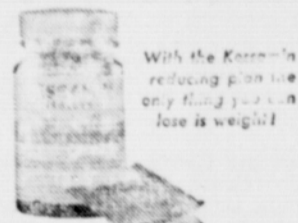
