**The Old Pistol River Cemetery**

On a sheltered bench, between Pistol River and Myers Creek, is the Old Pistol River Cemetery. There sleep the remembered and the forgotten, the marked or unmarked graves to which, in their turn, they were borne after they, in life, had borne their own folks or their neighbors.

Back from the busy highway of life, back from the curling breakers, yet not so far back as to blot out in oblivion their sounds, there are a dozen or so markers bearing the names of those whose moulds will lay forever.

There is a story, possibly a myth of spectral foundation, about the earliest marked grave, that of G. A. Hamilton, on whose marker the mossy figures tell us he passed on the 22nd day of July, 1888, and that he was 75 years of age, which would read that he was born in '23. As the tale goes, the poor old chap gave up his ghost on the Myers Creek hill, was buried on the spot, and a wooden fence put up about his grave. Time and the elements destroyed the fence, but through some now barely visible, perhaps, kindly deed, a stone in his memory was set up among those of his lifetime neighbors.

Because a newspaper sometimes forms the only connecting link with the past, the Pilot asks for anything anyone might know concerning this early settler whom, we hear, was nicknamed "Cap".

There should be some recorded memory of these unmarked graves. Again, because the earnest seeker after things that were frequently search the newspaper files, the Pilot will welcome, before it is again too late, any word from those among us who still remember, that it may come at least some mark that those who sleep their last sleep, there on that secluded bench, are not entirely forgotten among men.
