FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH

Sometimes I get just a little fed-up with the mollycoddling given the drunk by society. No matter how minor or major the crime, if the perpetrator can hide behind the cloak of drunkenness, he seems to elicit the sympathy of a public which ignorantly places him in the blameless category of those who know not what they do. They choose to ignore the fact that the drunk knew what he was doing when he proceeded to make a sot of himself in the first place.

For example, I read recently about a policeman who had killed a man in connection with a night burglary. While escorting the two he had apprehended to his car, a third, trying to slug him with a bottle from behind, was shot and killed.

Later developments brought out the fact that the victim was drunk. He had been in the car waiting for his friends while they were breaking and entering and when he attacked the policeman was merely coming to their aid. Undoubtedly there will be many who will immediately criticize the officer, accusing him of being trigger-happy and insisting that he should have been more careful about whom he was shooting. In the end they will be feeling sorry for the deceased because the poor creature didn't know what he was doing—he was just drunk.

All of which adds up to what I have been harping on for years; namely, that any man or woman who gets drunk has no right to expect sympathy from anyone, and particularly the law, when involved in a crime. But still, day in and day out, drunks commit murder, assault people on the highway, pull robberies and burglaries strengthened with the false courage given by alcohol, and get away with little or no punishment. Those who should convict excuse themselves by saying, "After all when Joe is sober, he is just like you and me".

Vets, Attention!

Elsewhere in this issue will be found an advertisement paid for by veterans and their kin, inviting attention to the Hoover and Bradley reports, both unfavorable to their interests. These ads urge all men and women eligible to join the veterans' group of their choice so their numerical strength will be reflected in Congress when these recommendations come up for consideration.

This ad is being circulated widely and it has already begun to attract members. Both veterans and eligible members of veteran's families are asking for applications. These people are beginning to realize the danger of more powerful interests influencing legislation detrimental to all benefits of service in the armed forces. The burden of initiating and keeping these post-service awards alive has been born by a few whose numbers must now be augmented quickly. VFW Post Commander "Red" Ross and Auxiliary President Edith Hines, originators of this advertising program, urge very serious consideration of the ad, saying they and their groups will welcome applications from dignitaries and especially ask that all persons make their choice and act.

Each of the signers of these advertisements have chipped in one dollar toward their cost and they will be continued as long as funds are contributed, with names changed, each run.

They overlook the fact that when Joe knows he is going to drive a car and still pours whiskey down his gullet, he is just as guilty of premeditated murder as the man who oils his gun, loads it, and starts in pursuit of his victim.

A man who is insane is protected by law against punishment. He is held not to blame. But the drunk is an idiot by choice, a voluntary lunatic, and such should have his punishment doubled rather than lightened.
