Here's what the American Bankers magazine, a publication which represents a traditionally hard-headed profession, has to say: "No business man or woman in any town should allow a newspaper to go to press without his or her name and business being mentioned somewhere in its columns. This does not mean you should have a whole, half, or even a quarter page advertisement in each issue of the paper, but your name and address should be mentioned if you do not use more than a two-line space.

At the tenth annual meeting of Save The Myrtle Woods, Inc., held this week, Kenneth Wolfe of Portland succeeded Lloyd J. Wentworth as president for the coming year.

Other officers elected were: Arthur K. Roberts, 1st vice-president; Mrs. Walter E. Wilhelm, 2nd vice-president; Milton W. Rice, treasurer; Thorton T. Munger, secretary; Mrs. Albert Powers, Mrs. Milford Nast and J. S. Emory, vice-presidents for Coos County; Hon. John Armacher, Vernon V. Harpham and William W. Tugman vice-presidents for Douglas County; Mrs. Dorothy Lockland, W. L. Crissey and S. O. Newhouse vice-presidents for Curry County and Mrs. Theodore W. Adams, C. P. Keyser, Lloyd J. Wentworth and George H. Schroeder, directors.

It was voted to extend the offer of \$1,000 to Douglas County toward the purchase of a myrtle grove along the Umpqua River. The possibility of acquiring other areas of myrtle in Coos and Curry Counties that would make good reservations was considered.

A resolution of appreciation of the late Alfred A. Loeb, who was active in this organization and for whom the Loeb State Forest was named, was passed.

Through the activity of this organization in the last ten years some 232 acres of virgin forest, mostly of the rare and unique Oregon Myrtle, has been acquired and most of it given to the State of Oregon for park purposes.

In addition 505 acres of public lands containing myrtle has been formally and permanently reserved from exploitation.

A letter from Judge James W. Harrison of the Coos County Court was read expressing his interest in the care and development of that county's parks, which contain some fine examples of virgin myrtle forest.
