SOUTHWEST BANK ... The financial trend in Oregon is very definitely toward the south west. According to the most recent report of bank debits, throughout the state the greatest increases have been in the five counties last to be developed. Compared with debits of May, 1955, those of the six reporting banks of the Grants Pass, Medford, Ashland area show the greatest increase—42.5 percent. The next greatest increase, 21.6 percent was reported by the 11 banks of Douglas, Coos, and Curry and the third increase listed 20.5, was from the 22 banks in the lower Willamette Valley. Average increase reported by 148 Oregon banks was 13.5 percent. The average in the 40 banks of the Portland area, including Hillsboro, Oregon City, etc., was 12.7 percent, while the 9 banks in the Hood River—The Dalles area noted a dropping of 7.1 percent although they had a rise of 6.9 percent during the month of April, '56.
