SECTION 4. The City Recorder shall enter upon the Lien Docket of the City of Brookings, Oregon, each piece and parcel of the above described real property, the area thereof in square feet, the owner thereof and the amount of the special assessment levied thereon.

SECTION 5. Each special assessment levied by this ordinance shall become, upon the entry thereof by the City Recorder as set forth and provided in Section 4, hereinabove, immediately due and payable and shall be a lien and charge upon the respective lots, tracts and parcels of land against which the same are placed. Each and every lien, so entered by the City Recorder, shall be prior to all other liens except as otherwise provided by law. Interest shall be charged at the rate of six per cent per annum until paid on all amounts not paid within thirty days from the date of entry of said lien. The City of Brookings, Oregon, may proceed to foreclose as delinquent any lien thirty days after the same shall have been entered in the City Lien Docket, as provided for foreclosure of liens in Chapter 89 Oregon Revised Statutes, or as hereafter amended.

SECTION 6. This special assessment levied by this ordinance shall be paid within thirty (30) days from the passage of this Ordinance unless other terms permitted by Ordinance have been made with the City Council.

SECTION 7. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Brookings, Oregon, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

 3. Every woodworker sees to it that no stray spark from his cigarette or power saw gets a chance to start a fire.
 4. Every logger "shuts down" his operation when the humidity reading gets in the neighborhood of 30.
 5. Every forest officer and public official charged with direct responsibility is on the job night and day.
 6. The general public now fully understands and fully supports forest fire prevention as one way to maintain the principal payroll and the greatest single economic and recreation resource of the Pacific Northwest.
- Regardless of weather, man-caused forest fires can be kept to a minimum if everyone takes care and cooperates. Remember, the first test is in preventing—the second is quickly reporting and extinguishing the forest fire. Let's KEEP OREGON GREEN.
