



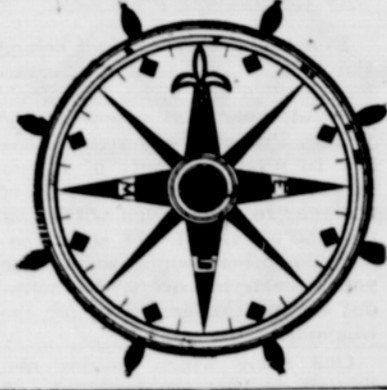

Steer Wrestling

IN RHYTHM WITH A CYCLONE, the saddle bronc rider rolls with the pitching of the horse and spurs over the break of the shoulders. If he touches any part of the saddle, the rein, the horse with his free hand he's goose-egged, and he can't wrap the rein around his hand or change hands. He must stay aboard eight or ten seconds (depending on local rules) and spur the bronc from shoulder to flank to earn the high score it takes to win.
